- Before 1832 only 3% of the population could vote.
- The suffrage movement began in 1903.
- The Suffrage movement wanted more rights for women.
- During WW1, women took on many of the jobs that men used to do such as farming, railways workers and making weapons.
- Women over 21 were allowed to vote in 1928.
- In the 19<sup>th</sup> Century, most women stayed at home to look after children.
- Emmeline Pankhurst founded two women's suffrage organisations.
- Emmeline Pankhurst was born in Moss Side, Manchester.
- Today, women have equal voting rights to men.
- In some countries around the world, women are still not thought of as equal to men.
