

- - **Mount Snowdon** is the highest mountain in Wales and stands at 1.085 metres tall.

The capital city of Wales is **Cardiff**, located in the south.

- The longest river in Wales is the River Tywi, which flows for 120
- Wales has a long coastline with many beaches and cliffs, especially along the Pembrokeshire Coast.
- Land use in Wales includes farming, forestry, tourism, and wind
- Much of Wales is mountainous and rural, especially in areas like Snowdonia National Park
- The Welsh language is one of the oldest living languages in Europe. Many people in Wales speak both Welsh and English.
- Popular tourist activities in Wales include hiking, surfing, exploring castles, and visiting national parks.
- Wales is known for its **castles**, with more castles per square mile than any other country in the world.
- National parks in Wales include Snowdonia, the Brecon Beacons (Bannau Brycheiniog), and the Pembrokeshire Coast.
